Going West: Migrating Musicians 31 March - 2 April 2023 (R)

During the nineteenth and early 20th centuries, there were great waves of migration from various parts of Europe to the 'New World' of America. Among those migrants were many talented musicians, both performers and composers, who either paid lengthy visits or settled there permanently. These include the Czech Dvořák, the Austrian Korngold, the Russians Rachmaninov and Stravinsky, the German Weill and the Hungarian Bartók. All of them responded positively in their music to the exciting young nation, and we shall explore their works through audio and video recordings, including those they produced in their new environment.



Embroidered Hare Pouch 11-13 April 2023 (R)



Tamara Karsavina was beloved by all. A product of Russia's Imperial Ballet, she danced with Nijinsky in Diaghilev's Ballets Russes; as part of his inner circle, she created iconic roles in The Firebird and Petrushka. Karsavina fled the Revolution to settle in London, later coaching Margot Fonteyn in The Firebird.

Day One: Diaghilev's Women: Tamara Karsavina

Ballerina/choreographer Bronislava Ninjinska was another product of the Imperial Ballet and sister of the great Nijinsky; she created her masterpiece Les Noces for the Ballets Russes. Perhaps under-appreciated in her lifetime, her fascinating life and career is now being reassessed.

Day Two: Diaghilev's Women: Natalia Goncharova and Misia Sert. Thursday 6 April 2023

When Alexander Benois suggested Natalia Goncharova to Diaghilev as designer of Le Coq d'Or, she was already a rising star within Moscow's avant-garde, with acclaimed exhibitions to her name. Soon promoted to Diaghilev's inner circle, her designs included Les Noces for Nijinska. A prodigious talent, Goncharova had a long and distinguished career in her new home, Paris.

Misia Sert was Russian-born of Polish descent described as 'a collector of geniuses, all of them in love with her', her salon hosted a who's who of Parisian artistic life. Diaghilev valued her artistic insights and relied on her generous financial support for a company always in crisis. Misia was at Diaghilev's side when he died in Venice, and she paid for his funeral.

A two-day course, however, each day can be stand-alone. This course is suitable for anyone not only wishing to know more about the history of ballet but also the lives of four women who made their mark in a man's world.

Watercolour Revision 11 - 13 April 2023 (R)



Some watercolourists get stuck in a rut and produce perfectly competent paintings that lack freshness and originality. Why is this?

A major cause is the "too much syndrome". We use multiple pigments separately and in mixing. We also use too many brushstrokes, often in an attempt to include too much irrelevant detail. During the process we lose the wonderful vibrant transparency that is the hallmark of good watercolour. This course is designed to refresh your entire painting process and get you out of that rut. This is a very inspirational day where you will work on pre knitted swatches, we will practice our embroidery stitches, add applique, embellish the surface in various ways including beads, crochet and pom poms. Indian Block Printing for the Home 14 April 2023



Learn about the traditional skill of Indian Block Printing with images of block printing around Jaipur, handling hand printed fabrics and hand carved blocks. You will print tissue paper, card and coloured papers in the morning using the collection of 50 Indian wood blocks experimenting with colour, design placement and repeats. After lunch, you will have the opportunity to print a textile item, a tea towel, linen fabric that can be used to make a runner or cushion, or a drawstring bag creating a unique product to take home. Caravaggio: His Art and Life 14 April 2023



Caravaggio had a brief and violent life, but his wonderful pictures contrasting dark and shade still resonate with artists to this day.

We look at nearly every picture that he ever painted, examine his life and travels, and analyse why his style proved so successful; Rembrandt and Rubens were just two artists who appreciated his work. Magnificent altarpieces and biblical scenes of great clarity and humanity dominate; the labels 'unique' and 'genius' can justifiably be applied. Suitable for all art enthusiasts.

The Poor We Always Have with Us 14 - 16 April 2023 (8)



Sickness, age and bad luck have always left members of the community vulnerable to poverty and hunger. Equally constant, however, over many centuries, have been the efforts of the national and local communities of England and Wales to provide a safety net for neighbours facing destitution.

This course examines those efforts - medieval alms, reformation poor laws and Lloyd George's national insurance scheme - and asks what the history of our welfare provision tell us about who we are.

Elizabeth I was the most remarkable woman of a remarkable age. Her reign was one of the great creative periods of English history - literature, music, art, architecture and overseas exploration all reached unprecedented heights. With passing reference to literature and architecture, this lecture will focus chiefly on the portraits, miniatures and music of Elizabeth's court. The aim is to demonstrate great levels of artistic achievement and to recreate something of the energy, spirit, and confidence of this Golden Age. Includes lunch. Do you have some cloth bound books in need of attention? Our focus on this course will be the repair and conservation of cloth case books including dry cleaning, paper repair, fixing dodgy sewing, repairing corners and re-backing without disturbing endpapers. We will colour cloth to match original bindings and generally spruce up and rescue battered books to be handled and read again with confidence! Suitable for students with some bookbinding experience but not necessarily in book conservation. Materials will be provided and students should bring their own books to work on, plus have a basic bookbinding tool kit. Ideal for anyone interested in Bookbinding, book conservation, archives, libraries, museums, etc.


Beginners Knitting 15 May 2023

Printing with Leaves using a Heat Press 199 22 May 2023

Enjoy a day exploring dye sublimation using a heat press to create unique and exciting designs. You will be carefully guided through the different stages by demonstrations and will begin by collecting leaves from the gardens. In the morning we will prepare dye papers and add colour to the leaves ready to print onto a range of different polyester fabrics. This fascinating technique produces vibrant designs with incredible detail and the results are often surprising. No experience needed, suitable for beginners interested in trying new textile techniques.

This is an ensemble course for upper intermediate level recorder players. This fully illustrated talk assesses a variety of his subjects with an attempt to better understand how Hogarth created art that was readily understood by the masses, but which was also sufficiently sophisticated to ensure that he remains much admired by connoisseurs worldwide over 250 years after his death. Chinese Brush Painting - Lotus Flower and Fish in Meticulous Style on Silk for Intermediate and Advanced Students 31 May - 1 June 2023

There are two main styles in traditional Chinese brush painting techniques: freehand style and meticulous style. Freehand style painting is known as literati painting or in Chinese "Xieyi", meaning write an idea. The Chinese painting technique of the artist scholar is more interested in personal expression than accuracy and details. This flower and bird course for beginners will start from basic skills from holding brush properly, mixing ink and colours, painting plum flower petals. branches and bird. Also, bamboo

and leaves. The tutor will conduct the course with brief introduction, subject demonstration and individual supervision, in a relaxing and active atmosphere. This practical course covers the basic skills of painting flower and bird in freehand style and will give students the chance to try out the techniques and materials used as well as looking at the culture behind the art. The tutor will help students learn how to hold the brush and mix different colours on to it. The course will also include some demonstration and individual supervision. No experience necessary, beginners are welcome.

During this course, you will learn the basics of textile screen printing using a stencil method. Inspiration for your hand cut paper stencil will come from exploring the beautiful grounds at Dillington House, collecting leaves or photographing flowers. You will hand cut your paper stencils and then learn how to prepare the screen and print your stencil on to a tote bag. You will also be shown how to print multiple colours or a two-layered print. No previous experience needed Zara is experienced with teaching all levels and will support you through every stage of the process.


Egypt's Romantic Ramesseum: A Ruined Temple and its Fallen Colossus 9 June 2023

Learn to Machine Sew Piped and Zipped **Scatter Cushions** 12 June 2023

Scatter cushions are used so much as decoration and for function in most people's homes, used to bring an accent colour into a room, as a design feature, also practically used for support. There are many shapes and sizes, from square, oblong and round, with the internal pads being made from polyester a synthetic base, suitable for those with allergies, or feather for a more luxurious look which will last longer and look good. This course is suitable for students with basic sewing skills, we will cover cutting out and making up a piped and zipped scatter cushion. You will need to bring your sewing machine to the course.

Embroidery Techniques on Leather for Bookbinding

4 - 6 September 2023 (R)

You can add very attractive surface decoration, texture and colour to books with simple techniques such as applying coloured leather onlays and sewn detail. From embroidered outlines to fully appliquéd sections, different stitches can be utilised to great effect. This course will teach the skills you need to build up a design which will be transferred onto a small leather-covered notebook. The course starts with learning about different embroidery techniques and stitches and making an embroidery sampler to test all these out. Students will then work with leather using these embroidery skills to build up their designs over coloured leather onlays. The course will conclude with the finished embroidered leather being stuck onto a text block to create a bound notebook.
